

PLACING CHILDREN IN KINDERGARTEN DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR

UNDERAGE CHILD TRANSFERRING FROM A KINDERGARTEN SITUATION

An underage child (not five years old by September 15 of the current school year) transferring to the Waterloo Community School District from a kindergarten situation will be admitted as a kindergarten student.

A child transferring during the first semester will enter kindergarten.

A child who transfers during the second semester will be admitted provisionally, with the District retaining the right to decide at the end of the year whether he/she should enter the beginning primary level or be retained in kindergarten.

CHILD OF LEGAL KINDERGARTEN AGE TRANSFERRING WITH NO KINDERGARTEN BACKGROUND

A child who moves into the Waterloo Community School District who has not attended kindergarten will be admitted during the first semester of the school year, if entrance age and other entrance requirements are met.

A child who registers for school during the second semester without any kindergarten background will be considered for entrance on an individual basis. A child who is denied admission, will enter kindergarten the following year, but will be placed in the beginning primary program as soon as it is determined a transfer will be beneficial to the student.
