

DUAL ENROLLMENT

The parent, guardian, or custodian of a student receiving competent private instruction (CPI, home schooling) may also enroll the student in the school district. The student shall be considered under dual enrollment. The parent, guardian, or custodian may request dual enrollment for a student in any or all of four areas, a) academics, b) extra-curricular activities, c) special education services, and d) testing. Notification should happen by September 15 or within two weeks (14 days) of becoming a resident of the district. Requests should be made on the Competent Private Instruction (CPI) Form A which is available at the Education Service Center.

A dual enrollment student is eligible to participate in the school district's extracurricular, special education and/or academic activities in the same manner as other students enrolled in the school district. The policies and administrative rules of the school district shall apply to the dual enrollment students in the same manner as the other students enrolled in the school district. These policies and administrative rules shall include, but not be limited to, athletic eligibility requirements, attendance policies, the good conduct rule, academic eligibility requirements, and payment of the fees required for participation.

A dual enrollment student whose parent, guardian, or custodian has chosen standardized testing as the form of the student's annual assessment will not be responsible for the cost of the test or the administration of the test.

After the student notifies the school district which activities in which they will participate, the school district will provide information regarding the specific programs. It is the responsibility of the Superintendent to develop administrative regulations regarding this policy.
