WHAT YOU NEED TO GRADUATE....

8 English Credits

6 Science Credits (must have Life Science)



- 6 Math Credits (must have completed Algebra 1)
- 6 Social Science Credits + 1 Economics
- 1 Health + 1 C3 + 4 PE Credits or PE Exemptions
- 44 total credits (minimum)

263 on Iowa Assessments- You will take this the first week in April MUST PASS ALL CLASSES AND RECEIVE 263 MINIMUM ON IOWA ASSESSMENT IN JUNIOR YEAR TO EARN RELEASE/LATE ARRIVAL IN SENIOR YEAR

JUNIOR YEAR TIMELINE, semester 1

<u>November</u>

- * Research college, military, & apprenticeship options
- * Look into/sign up for test prep sessions

<u>January</u>

- * Begin scheduling college visits
- * Organize scholarship info by deadline
- * Look into/sign up for test prep sessions

December

- * Research scholarships for Juniors: can use <u>www.ICANsucceed.org/scholarships</u>
- * Look into/sign up for test prep sessions

JUNIOR YEAR TIMELINE, semester 2

February

- * Schedule high school courses for next year
- * Register for April ACT/Sign up at West for ACCUPLACER (Feb. 15th)
- * Sign up/attend test prep sessions

<u>March</u>

- * Continue with college visits & scholarships
- * Attend test prep sessions

<u>April</u>

- * Continue with college visits & scholarships
- * Take ACT/take or retake ACCUPLACER

ACT vs ACCUPLACER

- ACT---entrance assessment for 4-year colleges or universities
 - Pre registration required online at <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
 - Timed, Saturday morning at West
 - Cost \$46 w/o writing (may qualify for waiver: Talent Search, income, etc.)
 - \$64 w/writing portion--check college recommendations
 - Usually take ACT in April of Junior year (deadline to sign up is March 9th)
 - SAT---usually for colleges on Coasts & South....check the college!!!
- ACCUPLACER---entrance assessment for 2-year colleges
 - Contact community college to set up time or offered at West on Thursday, February 15th at 9:00am (morning of P/T conference day)
 - Untimed (usually takes about 90 minutes)
 - Free the first time (or retake \$5 per part: Reading, Math, Writing)
 - Juniors usually take during 2nd semester of Junior year

COLLEGE VISITS, part 1

- Research suggests that you start investigating now!
 - o 2 year? 4-year?
 - Big or small campus?
 - Cost of college?
 - Does the college have the major in which you are interested?
 - On campus or off campus housing?
 - Public or private college?
 - How far away from home?



COLLEGE VISITS, part 2

- College visits ...
 - Generally occur during 2nd semester of Junior year & summer before Senior year
 - Parent/guardian notifies attendance office at West
 Office at west
 - Offer: a tour of campus, discussion of different majors, review application process, learn admission requirements, discuss financial aid process, and Q & A with current students
 - Get a feel for the college, prioritize your college choices & start to eliminate other colleges

RESUME

- Your resume will come in handy when you are applying for scholarships, need a reference letter, and are applying for jobs!
- It should include contact info (name, mailing address, email, phone number), extracurricular activities, service learning occasions, specialized trainings/certifications, work history, and possibly your cumulative GPA and college prep course taken in high school.
- A well written resume may help open doors for you! Ask someone to review!

TIPS FOR YOUR JUNIOR YEAR

• Meet with a college counselor Keep taking challenging courses Keep your grades up Make a list of questions before your college visits Talk with college students when you visit schools Learn about possible scholarships Try to be academically prepared for the ACT by spring



What can you do NOW to be college/career ready?

- Earn the best grades possible in your classes
- Enroll in challenging courses---the easiest road to high school graduation is not a benefit in the long run
- IMPROVE ATTENDANCE!
- Engage in activities and opportunities for growth
- Exercise the skill of prioritizing your time
- Check into & sign up for test prep sessions
- Ask 2-3 reliable adults to be a potential reference for you....someone not related (possibly a teacher, administrator, counselor, employer, coach, church leader, neighbor, or volunteer supervisor)

- Scheduling for your Senior year begins the end of January and ends the first week of March...
 - Start to think about classes you need & want for your Senior year
 - What are classes your specific college of interest requires for entrance and/or may be helpful for your college major?
