

SURVEYS OF STUDENTS

As part of a program funded by the United States Department of Education, no student shall be required to submit to surveys, analysis, or evaluation without prior consent from the student's parent/guardian. Consent must be obtained for survey revealing information concerning:

- Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student's parent;
- Mental and psychological problems of the student or the student's family;
- Sex behavior and attitudes;
- Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating and demeaning behavior;
- Critical appraisals of other individuals with whom students have close family relationships;
- Legally recognized, privileged and analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians and ministers;
- Religious practices, affiliations or belief of the student or student's parent; or
- Income, but not including income required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such program.

It shall be the responsibility of the superintendent, in conjunction with Education Service Center administrators and the principals, to develop administrative regulations regarding this policy.
