

SCHOOL FACILITY NAMES

The Board of Education believes names given to district facilities should have special significance to the community, its traditions, and values. The naming of buildings and other facilities in the district provides an opportunity to recognize the contributions of individuals or groups to education and to the life of our communities or to recognize the significance of the neighborhood, area, or community in which the school resides.

When the name of a school is being considered, the Site Council of the school will have responsibility for a process to gather input and will present a recommendation to the superintendent, who will make a recommendation to the Board of Education for its review and approval.

Ordinarily, an existing facility will not be renamed unless its present name becomes inappropriate because of the community it serves or the program it houses. In the case of a new school, the Site Council of the existing school most impacted by the creation of the new school will assume responsibility. In the event of a new building replacing an existing building, the Site Council may recommend to the Board of Education that the existing name be continued.
