News from Kindergarten

Oh my! Look at the amazing things our kindergarteners have been learning!

Reading: We have been reading books to identify characters and setting, along with learning and sharing ideas about the big idea: What makes a community? We have talked about the jobs of people/places in our community. We are working hard to learn and read sight words in text and isolation, along with decoding simple words using the letter sound relationships we know! You can support your child by helping them practice reading and writing sight words and finding them in books!

<u>Writing</u>: We have been learning how to write narrative books about something that has happened to us. In this, we have learned how to begin our writing with words like, "One __day," to get our readers attention. Overall, using pictures and words to tell about a topic is our goal! You can help them at home by asking them to draw a picture and add labels, then write a sentence about what they drew!

<u>Math</u>: We are currently in our measuring and counting unit, where students are learning how to measure and compare lengths of objects. They also are developing strategies for finding the total after a small amount is added to a set! Our next investigation in this unit includes playing games that involve counting, comparing, and finding the total when a small amount is added or taken away. Our next units is one of my favorites- 2-D and 3-D Geometry! You can help your child at home by playing games that use a dice, counting, and writing numbers!

Thank you for all the hard work you have been doing with your kiddos! They are rocking it!

1st Grade News

We continue to see amazing things happening in first grade. We are really working on addition and subtraction story problems. We are also finding out different ways we can make a number. For example, how many addition and subtraction problems can we make to equal 10. We are working on counting and counting on from any number between 0-120 both forward and backward. These are all great things to work on at home.

In reading, we continue to add more strategies to our toolbox. We are learning about what information we can find right in the story, but we are also learning how to infer, summarize, and determine what the story is trying to teach us. It has been hard work but we are all working very hard.

In writing, we are working on our information books. We are teaching others through our writing and illustrations. We have been learning a lot from one another. We are amazed at the experts we have in our first-grade classrooms.

We continue to put health and safety at the forefront of each day. They have done an amazing job with wearing a mask and keeping their hands clean. We work hard at keeping our friends safe.

Please continue to work every night on sight words and reading out loud. We will be taking our next test in January...we can't wait to see the growth all of our kids have made. As always, thanks for your support in your child's education. Contact us with any questions or concerns.

News from Second Grade

Oh my! Look at the amazing things the second graders have been learning!

Reading: We have been reading books about how to find beauty in the world around us and the joy of giving to others. The second graders have also been learning about how to identify the beginning, middle, and end of a story and how to make recommendations to others about books. Over the next few months, we will be diving into books written by Jan Brett and exploring different cultures through folktales. We will also learn how to ask questions to better understand the story.

<u>Writing</u>: We have been learning how to design a science experiment and how to write a lab report. The second graders have found out how to write their own hypothesis, observations, and conclusions based on the tests they conducted. We will continue our information writing unit by discovering how to write an animal research paper. The second graders will learn how to gather information on an animal and share that information in their papers.

<u>Math</u>: We have been making sense of and developing efficient strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems with totals up to 45. The second graders will be working on counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s and how to make numbers with tens

and ones. When at home, have your second grader practice counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s either saying the numbers out loud or writing them down.

We just finished up a unit on overhand throwing. We used the acronym SSET (Side-on, Step, Ear, Throw.) This cue served as an effective reference for our students and we have really seen some great progress.
